Sapodilla is commonly associated with a dark skin tone because of its brown skin and very sweet flesh. It is rich in carbohydrates, with 20% sugar content. It contains vitamins A, B, C, and high potassium, making it beneficial for blood vessel health.

Pomelo has thick, spongy skin and resembles an orange but is larger and colored white or pink. It contains flavonoids, pectin, and lycopene, which help reduce cholesterol, prevent anemia, and lower the risk of heart disease. Its skin can also be used for handicrafts.

Jaya Prima Bus Driver Under Investigation

The driver of the Jaya Prima bus that had an accident on Jalan Kadipaten, Majalengka, last Sunday, Egi Ginanjar (23), is now recovering after suffering shock from the incident. "He is currently being questioned. But we can't release the results yet because the investigation is ongoing," said Police Chief Commissioner Lena Suhayati on Monday (13/2/2012).

Traffic Unit Chief Commissioner Maman B Jiji added that they are also coordinating with the local transportation department to inspect the feasibility of the bus involved in the accident.

The accident, which occurred around 10:30 a.m., involved one bus, one sedan, two trucks, three horse carts, and four motorcycles. It killed three people and injured 25 others. Jajang Mujahid (41), a motorcyclist, died at the scene. Two others, Andri (22), a dump truck passenger, and Beni Kurnia Ilahi (29), died on their way to the hospital.

Seventeen people with minor injuries received outpatient treatment at Cideres Hospital in Majalengka. Six were treated in the ER, and two with serious injuries were referred to hospitals in Cirebon.

Lena also denied media reports that Egi Ginanjar only had a Class C driver's license. "He has a valid Class B1 public driver's license, meaning he was driving with proper documentation," Lena said. "We found the license with the driver's identity," she added. (kompas.com)
